Find an experienced Mentor

- A bachelor's degree is required for most positions in the finance field. However, there are some cases in which an associate degree would be sufficient.
- An associate's degree with a focus on finance can usually be earned in two years or less.
- A master's degree in finance can be earned in one to two years or less after completing a bachelor's program and is often preferred for a manager or director position.

- Consider taking an evening course at a local college.
- Spend some time at one day or weekend seminars to increase your knowledge.
- Attend professional meetings that bring together individuals from various financial arenas.
- Look for ways to develop new skills in your current job which would pave the way for a change e.g. offer to write a grant proposal if grant writing is valued in your new field.
- Consider alternative roles within your current field which would utilize the knowledge you already have e.g. if you are an Accounting professional, consider moving to a different role in your department that allows you to use your skills in a different way.
